
## Protect yourself and your family from the seasonal flu



Each year thousands of people are hospitalized because of complications from the flu. That's why we encourage our members to get their annual flu vaccination.

## Seasonal flu shot coverage

The cost and payment method of getting the flu shot depends on the plan you have and where you choose to get it. Below is a list of where to get the flu shot:

- At any primary care physician or in-network provider; PPO health plan members are eligible at both in- and out-of-network providers\*
- At CVS pharmacies, RediClinics  $^{\otimes}$  at Rite Aid pharmacies, or other retail-based clinics in accordance with your standard benefits plan  $^{\dagger}$
- At any in-network pharmacy if you have pharmacy coverage through Independence Blue Cross (IBX) prescription drug benefits<sup>‡</sup>
- If you do not know if your plan covers vaccines, you may call Customer Service at the number on the back of your ID card

## Seasonal flu reimbursement

If your plan includes coverage for vaccines and you paid for your flu shot, you may submit a *Seasonal Influenza Reimbursement Form* for reimbursement of up to \$50. For a copy of the reimbursement form, visit ibx.com/immunizations.

Please note, IBX continues to cover COVID-19 vaccination administration at no cost-share when obtained from an innetwork provider.

 $^{\star}$ Flu vaccines are not covered when administered to adults (18+) at pediatric offices/practices.
